Details about evaluation process

What are the four performance levels?

Lawmakers are grouped into four performance levels. Each level indicates to business leaders how, in general, legislators support economic growth, jobs and other broad job-related issues.

BUSINESS CHAMPION	76 - 100
MODERATE BUSINESS SUPPORT	56 - 75
MARGINAL BUSINESS HELP	41 - 55
ANTI-BUSINESS	0 - 40

What does a performance evaluation mean?

BIPEC’s performance evaluation (Eval.) is a measuring stick used to determine each legislator’s business philosophy, attitude and effectiveness in supporting growth of jobs in Mississippi. Over 60 business and professional leaders participate in the rating process. Key factors of the assessment are:

- Legislator’s votes on clearly identified economic principles and employer issues
- Leadership in committee and floor debates on job-related legislation
- Encouragement of other legislators to support economic growth and build coalitions

What types of votes are used in the ratings?

It is important to note that no single issue dominated BIPEC’s ratings. A great deal of effort is made to ensure that the votes chosen represent a broad cross-section of employer-related issues. Votes impacting operating costs and restriction of management choices are viewed as very important. Key subject areas include:

- Government growth
- Government regulation
- Privatization of government services
- Lawsuit reduction
- Environmental protection
- labor/management issues
- incentives for job growth
- Workers Compensation
- business taxation
- government spending controls

Who is BIPEC?

BIPEC was founded in 1980 by Mississippi business leaders to provide the solid research to identify legislative candidates who have a base of business knowledge. Members of BIPEC include individuals, hundred of small and large Mississippi businesses, and more than 35 trade associations.

BIPEC represents overall employer interest in Mississippi and is not tied to one industry. It is non-partisan, not a lobbying group, and not a political action committee (PAC). BIPEC can freely research, rate and recommend business-minded individuals who will promote economic growth and Mississippi jobs without worrying about party politics or lobbying for particular issues.

HOUSE VOTES - 2008 Regular Session

A – HB 215: Medical Malpractice. Measure to revise the certificate of consultation requirements in medical malpractice cases, specifically relaxing the procedures for plaintiff's attorneys in securing and presenting qualified expert consultants.

B – HB 593: Legislative Subpoena Powers. Measure to give legislative committees, the Attorney General, the State Auditor, and the Ethics Commission virtually unlimited powers to disregard court orders protecting confidential information (including trade secrets and other proprietary/financial information), allowing them to determine how the information is used

C – HB 639: Teachers Union Dues Checkoff. Bill to allow local school districts the authority to deduct union dues from payroll checks.

D – HB 592 Amendment #2: Unemployment Benefits. Vote on amendment prohibiting the lay-off of employees having filed a workers compensation claim.

E – HB 592: Unemployment Benefits. Measure to eliminate the one-week waiting period for eligibility of unemployment compensation benefits.

F – HB 909: Unemployment Benefits. Measure to incorporate automatic cost-of-living-increases tied to the Social Security Administration's auto COLA and Consumer Price Index increases.

G – HB 1482: Tax Exemption. Provides tax exemptions for individuals living in employer and non-profit housing organization assisted housing.

H – SB 2188: Outside Attorney Fees. "Sunshine Bill" – measure revising the authority of the Attorney General to enter into contracts for outside legal services.

I – SB 2988: Illegal Immigrants. Measure prohibiting the employment of illegal immigrants (and illegals seeking employment); mandates use of the "e-verify" system. The measure as passed places additional burdens/penalties on the employer making private employers an enforcing agent for immigration law.

J – HB 214: Tort Claims Act. Bill to clarify statute of limitations issues in tort claim cases.

2008 1st Extraordinary Session

K – HB 12: BIO-AG Lab Development Project. Economic development bond bill (\$88million) supporting the proposed Department of Defense BIO-AG Lab in Flora.

L – SB 2011: Unemployment Compensation. Vote on Final passage of measure to increase the weekly benefits paid via unemployment compensation from \$210 to \$250 in July 2008 to \$250 in 2009, then annual increases equal to the Social Security Administrations COLA determined by the Nat'l Urban Consumer Price Index.

M – SB 2011 Amendment #1: Unemployment Compensation. "Strike All" amendment vote regarding the formula for calculating unemployment compensation benefits.

SENATE VOTES - 2008 Regular Session

A - HB 1482: Tax Exemption. Provides tax exemptions for individuals living in employer and non-profit housing organization assisted housing.

B - SB 2188: Outside Attorney Fees. "Sunshine Bill" – measure revising the authority of the Attorney General to enter into contracts for outside legal services.

C - SB 2988: Illegal Immigrants. Measure prohibiting the employment of illegal immigrants (and illegal's seeking employment); mandates use of the "e-verify" system.

D - SB 2037: Citizenship Verification. Bill to require citizenship/legal alien verification of laborers working on government contracts.

E - SB 2173: MS Performance Review Act. Measure creating an independent commission consisting of the Auditor and other State Agencies representatives, to provide research, analysis, & recommendations to the MS Legislature.

F - SB 2594: Workers Compensation. Measure to provide that workers compensation law be impartially construed and applied and not presumed to favor one party over another.

G - SB 2680: State Personnel Board exemptions. Bill to impose a one-year exemption of certain state agencies and their employees from State Personnel Board procedures.

H – SB 2998: Tort Claims Act. Measure to provide immunity in tort claims to physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants providing medical services to Medicaid recipients.

I – SB 2998 Amendment #2: Tort Claims Act. Vote on amendment to change the language regarding applicability of "Medicaid recipients" versus "Medicaid eligible facilities". The measure as passed places add'l burdens/penalties on the employer making private employers an enforcing agent for immigration law.

2008 1st Extraordinary Session

J – HB 12: BIO-AG Lab Development Project. Economic development bond bill (\$88million) supporting the proposed Department of Defense BIO-AG Lab in Flora.

K – SB 2001: MS Dept of Employment Security. Vote to repeal the repealer regarding the transfer of power of the MS Employment Security Commission to the MS Department of Employment Security in the Office of the Governor.

L – SB 2005: Illegal Immigration. Vote to revise definitions regarding illegal immigrants and issues pertaining to employer immunity and liability.

M – SB 2011: Unemployment Compensation. Conference Committee Report vote. The conference report on SB2011 included an increase to \$230/wk in 2008, an increase to \$235/wk in 2009, and authorized MDES to conduct a study to determine the impact of increasing benefits below the maximum.
